Brubakken moved to recommend the City Council approve the new Police Department Policy Manual prepared by Lexipol. Seconded by Phillips. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Andersen moved to recommend the City Council accept the Transportation Alternatives Safe Routes to Schools Project grant, to a maximum amount of \$276,953, for construction of sidewalks in the JHS, Gussner School and TRAC areas. Seconded by Buchanan. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Buchanan moved to recommend the City Council direct the City Administrator to enter into negotiations with Interstate Engineering, Inc., to provide engineering services for the Transportation Alternatives Safe Routes to Schools Project. Seconded by Phillips. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Phillips moved to recommend the City Council approve the request from the Arts Center to close 2nd St SW from 1st Avenue west to the alley from Friday, August 25th through Saturday August 26th, midnight. Seconded by Buchanan. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Andersen moved to recommend the City Council continue working with Rehrig Pacific relative to the acquisition of waste carts for the conversion to automated pay as you throw garbage collection. Seconded by Phillips. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.
