On the expenditure side of the budget a 2% cost of living increase has been included. All requests for new or replacement equipment has been removed with the exception of the request from the Fire and Police departments for radio replacements. All outside agency requests in the General Administration budget have been removed.

Andersen moved to place up to \$5,000 in the General Administration budget to be paid to Community Service, on an hourly rate to be determined, based on the community service hours served for the City Sanitation and Civic Center departments. Seconded by Phillips. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.

Buchanan moved to place \$750 in the General Administration budget to be paid to the Garden Club. Seconded by Phillips. Voice vote showed: 3 ayes, 2 nays (Andersen, Gumke). Carried.

Andersen moved to place \$0 in the General Administration budget to be paid to the Chamber City Beautification Committee. Seconded by Gumke. Voice vote showed: 4 ayes, 1 nay (Phillips). Carried.

Andersen moved to place \$0 in the General Administration budget to be paid to the Fine Arts. Seconded by Gumke. Voice vote showed: 4 ayes, 1 nay (Phillips). Carried.

Brubakken moved to retain the \$121,400 request from the Police Department in the Equipment Replacement Fund Budget for 2018. Seconded by Gumke. Unanimous aye vote. Carried.
