FRIENDLY SNOW REMOVAL REMINDER TO ALL LOCAL CONTRACTORS

Please do not pile, snow blow, or push snow onto neighboring properties. We realize there are some areas where it is almost impossible or difficult not to do so, but please reach out to neighboring landowners or residents for permission before doing so.

Do not place snow piles in locations where the piles obstruct intersection sight distances, if at all possible.

If you have any questions at all on where to place snow, call the Street Department Shop at 252-4221 or the Street Foreman at 320-5501.

It is unlawful to place or deposit snow from any private property onto a City Street. City Ordinance below: Jamestown City Code Sec. 25-10.1. - Deposit on streets and allevs, etc.

It shall be unlawful for any person to remove snow, slush, or ice from private property or from any driveway, curb cut, or sidewalk and deposit the same upon the surface of any street or alley within the city. The snow and ice may be removed by the city and the necessary expense thereof shall be chargeable against the abutting lot or

(a) Violation of this section is a class B misdemeanor under the general penalty.

It is unlawful to remove snow and ice from a sidewalk and place onto a City street, unless given permission from the City Engineers office. The only area given permission is the Downtown Snow Removal District. See map of **Downtown Snow Removal District on** www.jamestownnd.gov for details. City Ordinance below: Jamestown City Code Sec. 25-10. - Snow and ice-Removal from sidewalk.

The occupant or owner of each lot or parcel of land and the owner of each unoccupied lot or parcel within the city, adjoining any street, and along which sidewalks have been built, shall clear the sidewalks, and shall keep clear sidewalks along such lot or parcel of land all accumulations of snow and ice. It is an offense for the owner of any lot in the city to fail to remove from such sidewalk in front of or along any lot therein the ice or snow. The snow and ice may be removed by the city, and the necessary expense thereof shall be chargeable against the abutting lot or property.

If your company does not do snow removal, you can disregard this message but feel free to pass along.
