The above Cemetery is situated on the NW 1/4 of Sec. 26, Tp. 140 N. R. 101 W. and is situated more particularly as follows: Commencing at a point 61.75 feet and 7/8 inch South of a point West 585 feet 2 inches from the post between Sec. 26 and 23; thence South for a distance of 404 feet; thence West for a distance of 143.5 feet; thence N 18° 22' E for a distance of 424 feet of beginning; thence East for a distance of 506.6 feet to point of beginning.

Numbers of lots are marked in the center of each; dimensions are marked at the corners.
